Greetings,

As of Wednesday, September 23 the Diocese of Northern Indiana has adopted the Michigan adaptation of the protocols for worship.

We know more about managing our lives safely in this pandemic now than we did in March. In addition, the diocese asked each parish to submit a Pastoral Plan for Regathering, and has helped identify what additional best practices needed to be in place for in-person worship. Adhering to protocols for gathering safely for in-person worship like ours, the dioceses in Michigan have allowed for in-person worship using the lower number of 25 % of full legal capacity OR seating with 6' between household groups.

Taking what we have learned into account, the missioners and Bishop Doug offered the "Michigan adaption" for consideration. After considerable discussion, most of the clergy and lay leaders supported adopting the "Michigan adaptation" for our diocese. This will require some additional work in reaching a specific number, given the size of each of your worship spaces. However, it could make it possible for more of us to begin gathering indoors for in-person worship weekly as we approach October. Father Ryan and Sr. Warden Greg Ellis are both in favor of us moving to this policy.

We will no longer have to wait until Thursday afternoon for a determination letter or track our numbers for 14 days. We will continue to follow all of the CDC Guidelines and protocols set in place. We will continue to wear facemasks. If Covid numbers spike and we are asked to close by Governor Eric Holcomb or Mayor Joe Thallemer we will do so, otherwise St. Anne's will be open for worship with up to 65 in the sanctuary and 35 in Rose Hall for a maximum of 100.

As you can see from the picture to the right, we are practicing social distancing, have our seats marked with blue tape, and are following the mask mandate.



NEW SOUND & VIDEO LIVESTREAMING

If you have not had a chance to join us for worship in person, the new live streaming of our 10:15 a.m. service is available to watch on our Facebook Page: St. Ann's Episcopal Church in Warsaw, IN. We are so very blessed to have the equipment needed to offer this service. Last year we had a private donor offer to match contributions given for a new sound system that would be designed for our space. In February the equipment was ordered and the week we had to close our doors the sound system was to be installed. The installers were still willing to install, and the sound is fabulous.

In April, the Center for Congregations was offering technology grants to churches to purchase video and sound equipment. St. Anne's received a grant to purchase the video equipment needed to pair with the new sound system to live stream our services for all to see and hear. On Sunday, September 20 our service was live with the new system in place. A special thank you to Samuel Schmidt for many hours installing the video equipment and to Scott Bianchini who is working with Samuel to learn how to run the system. They have each had a turn to be our video and sound technician for Sunday services. If you see either of them, please offer them a word of thanks.

KEYPAD ENTRY CODE

In March, at the start of the Covid 19 Pandemic, we were directed by the Diocese of Northern Indiana to close our office and work from home. Father Ryan and the Vestry made the decision to change the keypad entrance code that is used to enter the building to ensure that we could have proper contact tracing. We are still required to keep a list of who enters the building for contact tracing purposes. If you have a ministry that requires you to enter the building, please make arrangements with Carol Bianchini our Parish Administrator to come in during office hours or if you need to enter during non-office hours she can provide you with a temporary code. Until the contact tracing requirement ceases, the code will not be given out to various groups and ministries. (If you need cheeseballs, please contact Carol to come during office hours.)

MUSIC DURING THE COVID—19 PANDEMIC

We all know how important music is to St. Anne's during worship, it is a vital part of who we are. When the protocols were sent to each parish with the criteria that needed to be followed to have indoor worship, on the list was no singing. Our Director of Music, Bob Jarboe didn't like the idea of no singing in the sanctuary so he created a "Jarbooth". The Jarbooth that is pictured below allows one person to sing a solo or with the curtain pulled in the middle, a duet can safely be sung. The purpose of the Jarbooth is to keep all aerosols that escape during singing to stay within the booth keeping it safe for all those worshiping in the space. Good job, Bob!

STEWARDSHIP

In a Stewardship homily several years ago, I told you about my husband's Grandmother, Billie Rigdon, and her use of a special table grace on certain Sundays. If our prayer before dinner was, "Heavenly Father, for that which we are about to receive, make us truly thankful. Keep us mindful of the needs of others. In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen."

If that was the prayer, we knew, without a doubt that Grammie had burned the roast. It was her way of asking God to bless something that she had messed up. Something that had gone badly wrong.

It is easy to give thanks for great blessings and good things that happen in our lives. We feel good about ourselves, our lives, our families,

and we want to share that love and those blessings with others. But what about during times of trial and loss?

Since early in March, so many people in the world, in our community, and in our church family, have suffered losses. Lost jobs, lost hopes, but most tragic? Lost loved ones. What we were hoping for in the early Spring seems no longer possible as the leaves turn color and fall to the ground.

And so we wonder: Why should we give? Why should we continue to support our church with a pledge?

And the answer? According to the Very Reverend Sam Candler, dean of the Cathedral of St. Philip in Atlanta, Georgia: "We give thanks in the midst of loss the same way we give thanks in the midst of gain. We think outside ourselves; we think bigger than ourselves. Giving thanks means being willing to focus attention on something larger than ourselves. I do not mean thanking God for something gone bad or for some tragedy. BUT, God does know loss. And God does know the pain of our sadness when we lose. My God is the God who knows the height of my elation but who also knows the depth of my losses."

Personally, my sincere prayers are that the global pandemic will wane, that vaccines will be developed and distributed equitably around the world. That normalcy will return in our daily lives, in our common lives as members of St. Anne's Church in Warsaw. I miss our corporate worship, our warm fellowship, I miss seeing the bottom half of your beautiful faces!

And the best way to ensure that we can continue to be a family, a vibrant and supportive church family, is to prayerfully continue to support this parish by making a financial pledge of support.

As Grammie's other favorite table grace so simply but powerfully states: "Heavenly Father, what we have tis of thee. Take our thanks. Bless and quide us. Bless and quide those we love. In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen."

OUTREACH DOLLARS MAKE A DIFFERENCE
