It has been a long and treacherous thirteen-plus months since the beginning of the pandemic and the various restrictions it has placed on our lives. Thankfully, with vaccinations and some precautions, we can now enjoy many of the activities we sacrificed for everyone's health and safety; worship, education, and limited gatherings at the church have returned, giving us all a sense of hope for revitalization in our faith community.

I am particularly excited to see the return of Christian Formation activities, which include education for both children and adults. This spring, the leaders for each are Marla Norris and Julie Kuhn (K-6), Deb Blatz and Chuck Brindle (7-12), and Brenda Rigdon (*Walk in Love* adult book study) – many thanks to these volunteers for their service to our church! These activities strengthen the Body of Christ by broadening and deepening the faith of everyone involved; without them, the Body of Christ suffers both spiritually and intellectually. Let us say, therefore, that we are happy to give people more reasons to be here!

Other things have begun their gradual return; in worship, for example, we have a crucifer once again to lead our rather modest processions, which allows for a bit more lay participation in the liturgy (and I am a big proponent of that). I am not sure, though, of when we will be allowed to receive Holy Communion "in both kinds" (bread and wine); I have raised this matter with the Bishop and other clergy of the Diocese, and, as I understand, contact-free ways of administering both kinds are currently under consideration.

Elsewhere I have remarked that Lent began in early 2020 lasted all the way into 2021; certainly, when considering all the things we had to give up during that time, this is not all that inaccurate! We know that this "year-long Lent" affected the church in numerous ways (much as it affected our society), especially through increased institutional anxiety, division, conflict, and grief. Many of you, like me, have heard grave predictions of the collapse of churches because of demographic trends that were exacerbated by the pandemic. Frankly, I am not quite ready or willing to give in to such gloomy forecasts. I sense, too, that a number of people at St. Anne's possess the passion and vision to bring about a post-pandemic renaissance, which makes the future seem much brighter.

With God's help, we will see this renaissance, and all we need is the renewed commitment of the members of St. Anne's who so graciously offered of themselves in the past. Be assured that, as long as guidelines from the CDC and Diocese are followed, we can resume (if we have not done so already) many of our in-person activities, including meetings of our Standing Committees and the events and ministries for which they are responsible. Know, too, that I am available to be a part of this process and want to share my vision and hope for 2021 and beyond.

As many of us have grieved the isolation and loss related to the pandemic, please be reminded of this, which comes from Paul's letter to the Romans: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (8:38-39). Tired language of (especially) "social distancing" finds its death in these words of profound hope, because, while many things of this world can "distance" us from each other,







TREASURER'S REPORT

Gary Proietti, Treasurer

Greetings Everyone, Snow, Sleet and Sunblock! Welcome to Spring in Northern Indiana!



In the First Quarter of 2021 we applied for forgiveness of our SBA Loan (\$34,100) through last year's Payroll Protection Plan provided through the CARES Act. We have not yet received confirmation that the loan has indeed been forgiven, but we remain hopeful that we will receive word soon.

In January we received our abatement of one month's Diocesan Assessment (\$3,461.50) that was granted to all parishes. Our thanks to Bishop Doug, the Diocesan Council and Finance Committee for granting this much needed pandemic relief!

We filed our 2020 Parochial Report in which we were required to report the P.P.P. sponsored SBA Loan received as "Income" and thereby subjected to the 15% Diocesan Assessment. I contested this requirement stating that this money was specifically designated by the SBA to be used for Labor, Labor Expenses and Utilities, and not in our opinion, to increase a Church's assessment to their Diocese.

After an incredible effort, all uncollected Cheeseball Income has been received from our Vendors and Parishioners. Thanks to Carol and all our volunteers for their incredible efforts! We still have many unsold Cheeseballs.

OUTREACH DOLLARS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Thank you for giving generously to our outreach ministries! In January, February, March and April St. Anne's gave:

- \$715 was donated to The Beaman Home Shelter along with several pairs of pajamas.
- \$880 was donated to Fellowship Missions along with baskets full of toiletries.
- \$680 was donated to B.A.B.E. along with a collection of baby supplies.
- \$875 was donated to C.A.S.A. along with board games and supplies.
- \$1534 was given for rental assistance to people from the community.
- \$109 was given as thank you gifts for Christmas.
