



O God, who made this holy day to shine with the glory of the Lord's resurrection: Stir up in your Church that Spirit of adoption which is given to us in Baptism, that we, being renewed both in body and mind, may worship you in sincerity and truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles 10:34-43


Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ-he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

A Reading from the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians 15:19-26

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

At the conclusion, the lector says The Word of the Lord. *People* Thanks be to God.

The Holy Gospel

When the Celebrant announces the Gospel, all respond Glory to you, Lord Christ

The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to John 20:1-18

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had

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been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, `I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

The Celebrant addresses the people in these words, all standing

Through the Paschal mystery, dear friends, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into his death, and raised with him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, now that our Lenten observance is ended, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy catholic Church.

Celebrant	Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?
People	I do.
Celebrant	Do you believe in God the Father?

People	I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
Celebrant People	Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God? I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
Celebrant People	Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
Celebrant People	Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers? I will, with God's help.
Celebrant People	Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? I will, with God's help.
Celebrant	Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?
People	I will, with God's help.

The Prayers of the People Officiant offers a series of biddings. The congregation responds with the words in italics.

Note: During the Prayers of the People members of St. Anne's Search Committee leave their seats, move toward the front of the sanctuary, and stand in a single file line along both side walls of the sanctuary. Ritual of Commissioning and Deputizing of St. Anne's Search Committee

Sr. Warden: I invite members of St. Anne's Search Committee to stand before the congregation. We note that two members, Lynn Kerber-Eastlund and Brenda Rigdon are virtually present participating by way of this live-streamed service. (Search Committee members move to create a single line in front of the communion rail, facing the people.)

Sr. Warden: We are grateful for your ministry on behalf of our search for a rector for St. Anne's. You have been duly appointed by the Vestry to attend to the voices of St. Anne's members as they have expressed their perceptions and aspirations for St. Anne's as expressed in the results of our CAT survey summary, the work of our conflict transformation journey, and in one-on-one conversations with you. Today, the Vestry and our church members formally commission and deputize you and your ministry going forward. I therefore assert that: Saint Anne's Search Committee is deputized by the Vestry with discerning rector candidate skills, abilities, characteristics, and "fit,"

that meet the needs of our parish as revealed in the recent parish self-study and selfwork processes. The responsibilities of the search committee include the development of a prayerful process of discernment, the development of the Parish Profile and Office of Transition Ministries, OTM, Portfolio, the conducting of a search for suitable candidates, and the selection of a final candidate to recommend to the Vestry. Specific expectations include:

- The search committee has the authority to guide the planning, research and interviewing for the search process;
- The search committee will consider our vision for the future based on the parish self-study and self-work processes such as our conflict transformation efforts;
- The search committee is accountable to the Vestry for its work and actions and will work in faithful discernment of this charge;
- The Vestry will review and approve the Parish Profile before it is released;
- The Vestry will review and approve the OTM Portfolio before it is released:
- The Search Committee will follow the process endorsed and recommended by the Diocese for rector search processes and coordination with the Diocesan Transitions Office throughout this process;
- You will provide regular and appropriate communication with the parish, including Sunday morning updates and use of the bulletin and newsletter, to keep everyone informed of the committee's progress;
- The search committee will maintain appropriate confidentiality about its work with particular regard to candidate information;
- You are entrusted with the effective use of financial resources designated for the search process within a budget of \$15,450.00;
- The search committee will be committed to finding the best person as the best fit for this position;
- You will present one final recommendation to the Vestry for the candidate to be called as Rector.

The negotiation of employment contracts including compensation and benefits, and the issuance of a Letter of Agreement, will remain the responsibility of the Wardens and Vestry in consultation with the Bishop. This Commission and deputization is signed by me this day, Easter Sunday, April 20, 2025.

Members of St. Anne's Search Committee, do you accept this commission and deputization?

Search Committee: I do!

Sr. Warden: St. Anne's community of faith, do you promise your continued prayers and support for, then acceptance of, the recommendation of the search committee's ministry for our new rector?

All: We do! Presider: To effect this covenant of mutual ministry in the work to call a new rector to St. Anne's, let us pray:

All: Eternal and compassionate God, who by the Holy Spirit presided at the council of the Apostles, to guide them in all knowledge and truth: Be present with the appointed members of St. Anne's Search Committee. In the passions of their search for, and debate about rector candidates, give them a quiet spirit, in the complexities of considerations, give them clear minds, and in the moments of decision, give them courageous hearts. Guide them in all of their special ministry on our behalf, to seek only your glory, and the good of your Church; through Christ Jesus our Lord. AMEN!

Sr. Warden: In the name of God and on behalf of St. Anne's we commission and deputize you as St. Anne's Search Committee. I present to your co-chairs, Diana Creech and Gregory Ellis, a signed copy of the Vestry's Commission to you. Could I have an audible affirmation of this community's support for them? (*Start Applause*)




The Great Thanksgiving

Eucharistic Prayer D (Book of Common Prayer, p. 372)



The Celebrant sings the **Proper Preface**

It is right, and a good and joyful thing,...who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it, and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

Celebrant and People

We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you, Lord our God.

The Celebrant continues

Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, with St. Anne and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.






